7. County Warden's Welcome and Remarks

Good evening:

I would like to begin my expressing my condolences to the family and friends of those we've lost to COVID-19.

It has been a long and difficult winter, but there is hope on the horizon in the form of vaccines.

Thanks to the steady and consistent leadership of Dr. Ahmed and Theresa Marentette of the Windsor-Essex County Health Unit, Windsor-Essex is leading the province when it comes to vaccinating our most vulnerable residents.

It was a welcome and historic day Monday when the health unit began mass vaccinations at the WFCU Centre for those aged 80 and over.

They will expand their operation to Essex County next Monday, when they open a second mass vaccination clinic at the Nature Fresh Farms Recreation Centre in Leamington.

Essex County residents aged 80 and over must pre-register for their appointments on the health unit website.

Anyone encountering issues with pre-registration can call 519-251-4072.

I took a tour of the WFCU mass vaccination facility earlier today along with members of the media, and there was a palpable sense of optimism in the air.

The tremendous amount of good that is being done there will only grow by leaps and bounds as our vaccine supply ramps up as expected.

As of this morning, 11,488 Windsor-Essex residents have received both doses of the vaccine and 5,740 have received their first dose for a total of 28,916 doses.

I would like to praise Essex-Windsor EMS Chief Bruce Krauter for the incredible work he has done organizing this monumental vaccination effort. They are so many moving parts to a massive undertaking like this and the Chief is helping to ensure everyone and everything is working in concert for the benefit of our residents.

I would also like to thank the hard-working Paramedics of Essex-Windsor EMS. They were on site providing medical coverage at the mass vaccination clinic and their expertise and skills will no doubt be called upon as the pace of vaccinations increases.

Finally, I would like to again thank the residents of Essex County for doing everything they can to slow the spread of COVID-19 and keep our community safe.

Your selfless efforts are paying off in the form of reduced case numbers and you are most definitely saving lives.

15.1 Support for Local Wineries

Nelson Santos brought forward a Notice of Motion as follows:

WHEREAS the Ontario wine industry supports directly and indirectly over 18,000 full-time equivalent jobs; and Ontario is the largest

wine growing region in Canada responsible for over 2/3 of Canada's grape production;

WHEREAS, with 2.4 million annual visitors to Ontario's wine regions, Lake Erie North Shore's wine sector has developed unique experiential destination tourism, enhanced by the proximity to the City of Windsor;

WHEREAS COVID-19 has had significant impacts on Ontario's wine industry – a key contributor to Lake Erie North Shore's economy and tourism sector;

WHEREAS to build back a stronger, more sustainable economy, there is a need to unlock the potential of Ontario's grape and wine industry.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the County of Essex CALLS on the Province of Ontario to create a level playing field and to provide Ontario's entrepreneurial wine industry with opportunities to invest more into innovation and job creation while providing consumer choice and convenience for the purchase of Ontario wines;
- 2. That the Province BE URGED to undertake the following:
- Eliminate the 6.1% tax applied to VQA (100% Ontario-grown) wines on sales in the 2021 Budget;
- Enable Ontario wines to offer direct delivery, with margin, to grocery stores;
- Establish long-term VQA wine support programs at the LCBO that would increase shelf space for VQA wines and;
- Eliminate import taxes on 100% Ontario VQA wines.
- 3. That this motion BE CIRCULATED to municipalities in Niagara and Prince Edward County and to MPP Taras Natyshak, MPP Rick Nicholls, the Premier, the Minister of Finance and the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs.
