

THE PROBLEM

A chronic doctor shortage and a lack of walk-in clinics with extended hours in Windsor and Essex County is contributing to excessive waits at emergency rooms, persistent ambulance shortages and substandard health outcomes for regional residents.

PHYSICIAN SHORTAGE

- Over 31,000 residents are without a family doctor
- Nearly 50% live in vulnerable neighbourhoods
- The number could reach 100,000 in 5 years

911 TRANSPORTS

- Provincial average of patients who arrive by ambulance at hospitals: 18%
- Averages at our 3 hospitals: 38%, 31%, 23%
- This ties up paramedic resources, contributing to Code Blacks and Reds
- These Code Blacks and Reds undermine public faith in the health care system

SUB-STANDARD HEALTH CARE OUTCOMES

- Premature deaths in Windsor-Essex are 56.3% higher than Ontario average
- Potential years of lost life locally are 63.4% higher than average
- Windsor-Essex suffers higher incidents of: hypertension, hypercholesterolaemia and other dyslipidemia, depression, asthma and acute and other respiratory diseases and disorders

THE SOLUTION

Team-based models of care focused on preventive medicine and connecting with vulnerable communities are achieving success on a small scale in Windsor-Essex. Additional provincial support will allow us to expand their reach and positive impact.

There are currently **13 Expressions of Interest** for team-based models awaiting review and approval at the ministry level. We urge you to address them on an expedited basis.
