#### Purpose

The purpose of this Administrative Report (the "**Report**") is to provide County Council with the necessary information to consider the draft Delegation of Authority By-law.

## Background

The Warden and certain Members of Administration have historically exercised certain delegated authority. However, that delegation of authority is often buried in legislative provisions, existing County By-laws, or in a past practice that is not well documented or specifically provided for.

County Administration recognized that this was a problem, with the previous County Clerk starting the process to draft and present a consolidated Delegation of Authority By-law in or about 2018. However, that process was derailed by the COVID-19 pandemic, and further impacted by the retirement of the previous County Clerk who had started the process.

## Discussion

The issue of the need for a Consolidated Delegation of Authority By-law was brought to the forefront again due to the adoption of the County's Strategic Plan.

Goal 2 of the Strategic Plan, entitled Growing as Leaders in Public Service Excellence provides that the County will focus on becoming recognized as a leader in regional governance and a trusted provider of quality public services. Strategic Direction 5 under Goal 2 calls for an elevation of County Council's collaboration and decision-making capabilities and capacity. To assist in achieving this Strategic Direction, the Strategic Plan called for, among other things, for a "review and update [of the] delegation of authority by-law to streamline decision-making".

Further, Section 270(1) of the *Municipal Act* provides that municipalities **shall** adopt and maintain certain policies, including, "the delegation of its powers and duties". As such, Council adopting a Consolidated Delegation of Authority By-law will not only advance the Strategic Plan, it will also bring the County into compliance with Section 270(1) of the *Municipal Act*.

As stated in this Report above, there has never been a comprehensive Delegation of Authority By-law. As such, Administration has drafted a Consolidated Delegation of Authority By-law that takes into account:

- (1) the established practices of the County;
- (2) the provisions of the *Municipal Act*;
- (3) existing By-laws of the County that specifically delegate authority; and
- (4) best practices from other municipalities.

The draft Consolidated Delegation of Authority By-law attempts to clearly outline the delegation of authority and allow Administration to use the delegated authority to address matters in a timely fashion, while concurrently maintaining accountability to Council for the actions taken by those exercising the delegated authority.

# **Financial Implications**

There are no financial implications to adopting the proposed By-law.
