# Milwaukee's Kevin Shafer recognized for Excellence in Water Management

The Wisconsin Academy of Sciences, Arts, and Letters recently recognized Kevin Shafer, Executive Director of the Metropolitan Milwaukee Sewage District (MMSD) as a Fellow for his outstanding work in water management in the Milwaukee area. Kevin has been Mayor Tom Barrett's lead person for the past 16 years for dealing with one of the most serious stormwater and wastewater challenges in the Great Lakes. Kevin has completely turned around MMSD's performance with innovative approaches using green infrastructure, management of the deep tunnel system, Green Luminary Awards, cooperative efforts with the greater Milwaukee area, and much more. He has also been recognized for excellence nationally and internationally. Congratulations Kevin!

## **Thunder Bay Climate Change Website**

EarthCare Thunder Bay, along with Lakehead University, launched a climate change website aimed to further engage citizens on the issue of climate change in Thunder Bay. <u>ClimateChangeTBay.com</u> draws more citizen engagement through education, sharing stories, and calls to action.

## **Coast Guard Authorization Act 2017**

Last week, the Coast Guard Authorization Act of 2017 came up for a vote in the US Senate. The Act contained the Vessel Incidental Discharge Act (VIDA) which would have essentially removed Clean Water Act regulation of ballast water discharges. Great Lakes advocates, including the nearly 200 attendees of the nearby National Association of Clean Water Agencies meeting, at which Cities Initiative President/CEO John Dickert was in attendance, mobilized to educate Senators on the impacts of eliminating Clean Water Act authority over ballast water. Thankfully, the proposal was ultimately defeated with a procedural vote. The Cities Initiative maintains its longstanding position that comprehensive, uniform, achievable, and protective ballast water standards are needed in the US and Canada, as well as harmonization between the two countries where appropriate.

## **Update on Straits of Mackinac Incident**

On April 1, 2018, American Transmission Company's utility cables and the Enbridge Line 5 twin pipelines were struck and damaged, potentially by the anchor of a passing boat. As a result, 600 gallons of dielectric fluid was released from the cables into the water. This is a fatal substance for humans when ingested and toxic to aquatic life. Three dents were also identified on the Line 5 pipelines. The US Coast Guard has been overseeing the clean-up of the spill as well as the investigation of the incident. As well, the Line 5 pipelines were temporarily shut down for inspection. To learn more click <u>here</u>.

## Lac St. Pierre Conservation

In mid-March, the Quebec government announced, in the presence of Mayor Serge Peloquin of Sorel-Tracy, its plans to allocate \$14 million over 5 years for the protection of Lac St. Pierre. The government will embark on a two-part plan, focused on wildlife and habitat restoration and promoting sustainable agriculture. To read the plan, click <u>here</u> (in French).

### Lake Huron Management Plan Released

Environment and Climate Change Canada and US EPA recently released the <u>2017-2021 Lake Huron Lakewide</u> <u>Action and Management Plan</u>, as called for under the Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement. The plan assesses the health of Lake Huron, identifies critical threats such as chemical contaminants, invasive species, and nutrient pollution, sets priorities around research and monitoring, and identifies additional actions that should be taken by the governments and the public to address threats to the Lake. The report assesses Lake Huron's condition as "fair".

## FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES - US

### Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act Financing

WIFIA is a new federal credit program administered by US EPA for eligible water and wastewater infrastructure projects. WIFIA can fund development and implementation activities for projects like: 1). Wastewater conveyance and treatment projects; 2). Drinking water treatment and distribution projects; 3). Enhanced energy efficiency projects at drinking water and wastewater facilities

### **Deadline: TBD**

It is anticipated there will be another round of applications for WIFIA at the end of the year, assuming the federal appropriations are authorized by October.

### **US Forest Service Funding**
